**OPEN LETTER TO PRIME MINISTER CARNEY:** The Canadian Conference Of Catholic Bishops sent a letter expressing grave concerns about amendments to Bill C-9, which could have serious impacts on religious freedoms. The proposed amendment would remove the current "religious exemption" from Canada's hate speech laws. While noting the importance of protecting vulnerable individuals and groups and condemning hatred, the bishops raised a serious caution—that this amendment could cause uncertainty for faith communities and their

representatives, as the expression of traditional moral doctrines may be mis-interpreted as hate, and subject the speaker to severe legal consequences. Anyone who shares these concerns, please contact their local Member of Parliament and respectfully urge the government to reconsider this legislation. READ OPEN LETTER
