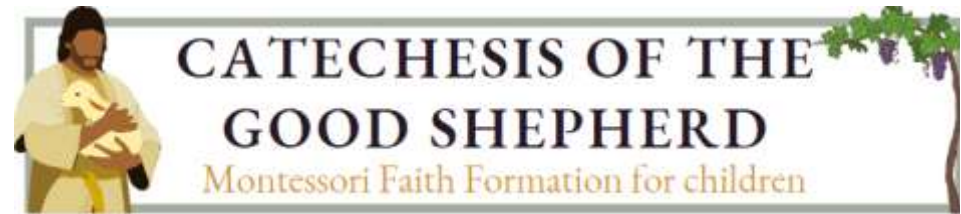

LEVEL 1 (3 – 6 YEARS OLD)

In the Level 1 Atrium, “Good Shepherd” catechesis, children rediscover...God is love, Jesus is risen, and we are His sheep.

- Children enjoy biblical accounts of events such as the birth of Jesus and the Last Supper, to proclaim that Jesus was a real person who lived in a specific place in time.
- Children encounter elements of the liturgy, to encourage understanding and thoughtful participation.
- Children partake of prayer opportunities, alone and in community, for enjoyment of God’s gifts.
- They contemplate parables that allow them to ponder the mystery of the Kingdom of God, especially the call to joyful relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

LEVEL 2 (STARTING AT 6 YEARS OLD)

As children move into Level 2, firm in their relationship with God, they wonder ... What is God’s plan? What is my role in God’s plan?

In response,

- They hear about God’s Plan of Salvation as shown to us in the Bible.
- They contemplate the gifts that human beings have received from God through time.
- They develop their moral intelligence by considering the parables Jesus told of mercy and justice, as well as his moral guidelines.
- They discover their role in God’s plan and their own place in the community of believers – the church.
- They acquire the tools to enable them to access the Word of God (Bible) and the prayers of the church in the rites of Eucharist, Baptism and Reconciliation.
