#### WHO IS THIS PROGRAM FOR?

- Children who are **Baptized** and in Grade 2 and up.
- Grade 2 students of Immaculate Conception and Monsignor O'Donoghue schools.
- Children of any family who attends Immaculate Conception Parish.
- If your child does not attend these schools, either:
  - Register at Immaculate by contacting the parish office.
  - o Provide a Letter of Reference from your home priest.

- Starting October 1st, 2025 (includes parent meeting with Fr. Jozef Vano, starts at 4:30 p.m.)
- Wednesdays typically from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m.
