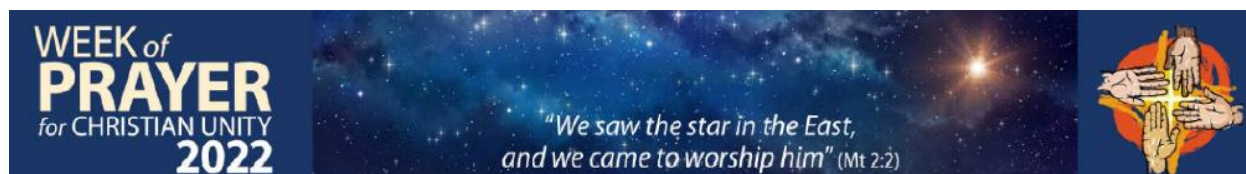

The series showcases people over the age of 70 from across the globe (including the Pope himself) sharing their insights and stories with young filmmakers. **Each of the four episodes** takes up a central theme: "Love," "Dream," "Struggle" and "Work." Although a few well-known people like Martin Scorsese and Jane Goodall are featured, most of the participants are not household names. This project reflects Pope Francis' often stated desire that young and old should speak with one another. If you subscribe to Netflix, it is well worth watching!
