FUN QUIPS FROM FR. LUIS: The city's Catholic cathedral was having some extensive repair work done on its upper floors. To get material up and down, workers rigged something called a "cage elevator". A characteristic of these elevators is that the gate must be closed manually before it can be called to another floor. On one afternoon, one of the workers, Peter by name, took the elevator to the top floor and forgot to close the gate. Unfortunately, the elevator was needed back on the first floor. The cathedral's pastor was walking by and decided to help. That's when visitors to the cathedral were treated to the sight of the pastor of the cathedral shouting up to the heavens: "Peter! PLEASE CLOSE THE GATE!"

MASS STIPENDS SUPPORT OUR PRIESTS: Did you know that the \$20 stipend paid for scheduling a Mass Intention does not go toward maintaining the parish? Actually, it is all sent to the Diocese to be allocated \$15 to the Priest Benefit Fund, and the remaining \$5 distributed equally to our active priests. Currently we are booking Masses into March, 2026. If you are looking for a specific date, the best way is to get on the "annual" list. This works as follows: As soon as the next year's Mass book arrives (approximately March), Patsy will call you to confirm whether you want your date(s) again and will ask you to pay the stipend at that time. Basically, you are paying a year in advance to reserve your date(s). Patsy will call you again the following year. How does that sound? (Set it and forget it!)
