LITURGY NOTES—IS FATHER ASLEEP?



When we observe the moments of silence that the liturgy calls for, the first thing we usually feel is that something is not right, like "dead air" on the TV or radio. It helps to allow a little extra time for this adjustment, so that we can enter deeply into the moment of prayer. The first such pause for prayer occurs when the priest says, *"Brothers and sisters, let us*

acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries". This invitation reminds us that God comes to us in mystery, and we are on the threshold of the great mystery of Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ. We are here to encounter together the God of all that is, the all-holy Trinity, and be fed by the flesh and blood of the incarnate Son of God. He has saved us from our sins, and we humbly come before him seeking forgiveness for even the least of whatever distance we have put between ourselves and the loving God who made us.

We acknowledge that we are all sinners and cannot live without the forgiveness won for us on the Cross. There is no formula to follow, but we should examine our conscience for a moment and allow the Lord to open our eyes to our need for forgiveness. Before we say the Confiteor (*"I confess to Almighty God"*), it may help to think about its own list: my thoughts, my words, what I have done, and what I have failed to do. How have I sinned in thought; word; action; failure to act? A brief moment spent in this silent reflection, all together before the Lord of heaven and earth, prepares us for the sacred mystery of salvation through the Cross of Christ which we encounter in the Mass.
