### LITURGY NOTES—MAKE A GOOD ADVENT, AND YOU WILL HAVE THE BEST CHRISTMAS

Resist the temptation to rush the season and put up all the Christmas decorations right away and start playing all the Christmas music. Christmas didn't come the first time without centuries of waiting, of longing for a Messiah and a Saviour. Jesus will return again at the end

of time, and the only fitting way to spend our time on Earth is in longing for Jesus to appear and to bring us to our true homeland. At the start of the great prayer of the Mass, the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest stands before God, and asks on our behalf (in the Preface of Advent I) that "when he comes again in glory and majesty, and all is at last made manifest, we who watch for that day may inherit the great promise in which we now dare to hope".

Dare we hope for this joy of an eternal reward, when we cling to so many sins, and continue to hurt one another in so many ways? Yes, but only because we throw ourselves on the mercy of God, and trusting in his mercy, dare to hope that we will be delivered from the consequences of our sins. But we can only know the depths of God's mercy if we long for it. So, keep a good Advent; hold off on all things Christmas as much as you can, but long for them, and tune your heart to that longing deep within for union with God and dare to hope for the celebration in Heaven that our Christmas celebrations foreshadow. Advent is God's gift every year of a chance to have a fresh start to our lives and begin to think again about a world lost without a Saviour, when the Messiah was only a rumour, and each one of us is invited to start a new spiritual journey of longing for God. For our longing has only just begun.
